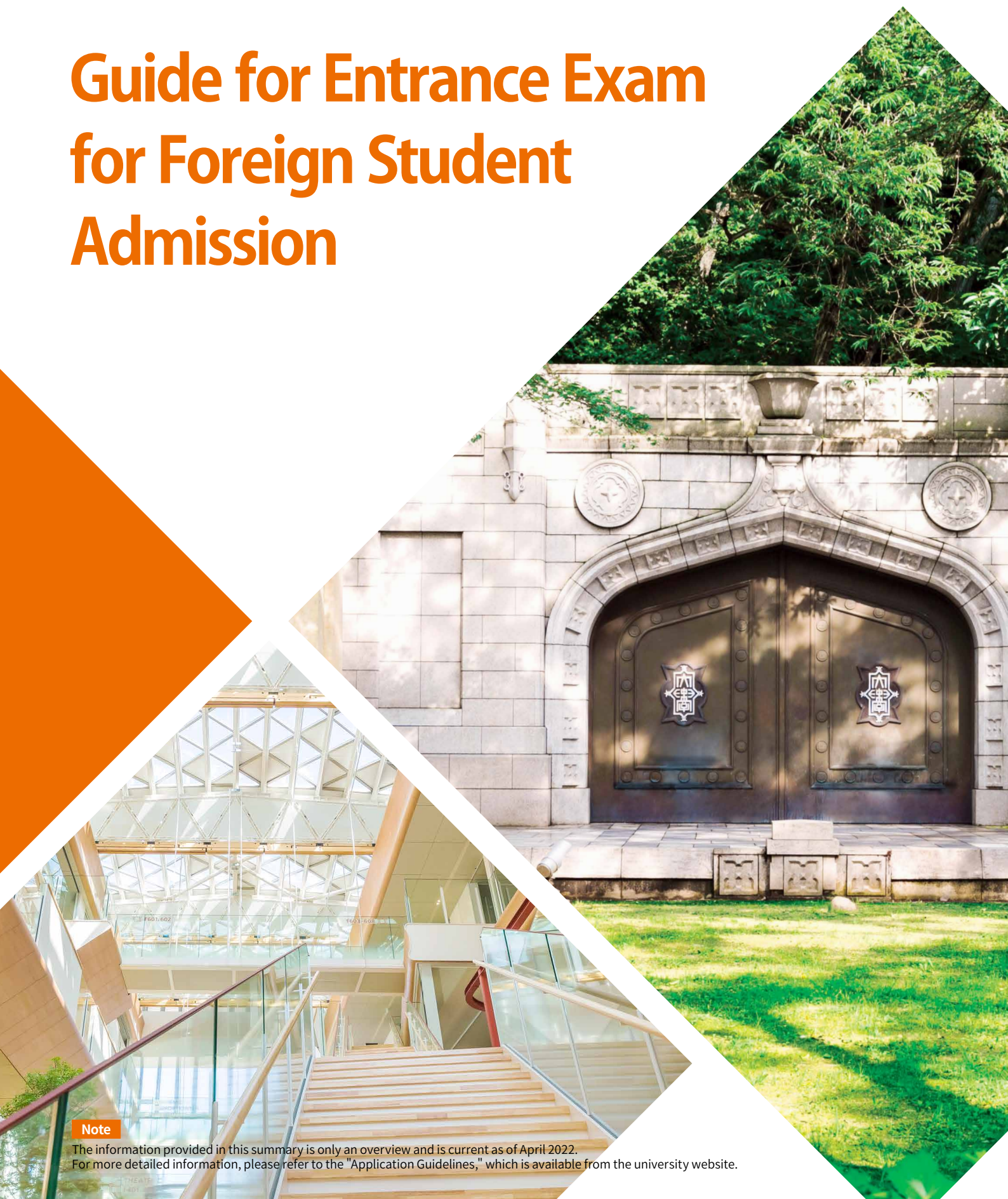

- For any of the faculties, a score from either the first (June) or second (November) 2022 Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU) is required.
- The score from an English proficiency requirement (TOEIC®, TOEFL iBT®, or IELTS) test should be within two years before the first day of the Application period.
- Applicants may not apply to more than one faculty that holds the exam on the same day.
- Essay writing questions are to be provided and answered in Japanese.
- Applicants may not proceed to "2nd Screening" unless they pass "1st Screening."
- In the interview at the Faculty of Science and Engineering, questions may be asked to confirm fundamental academic ability in mathematics, physics, chemistry, and biology, etc.

Curriculum

With the exception of subjects exclusively provided for international students such as “Japanese Language,” international students will basically take the same classes as Japanese students.

As **most classes are conducted in Japanese** except those in the Faculty of Global Management*, a level of Japanese proficiency sufficient to understand specialist lessons is required.

*In the Faculty of Global Management, about 70% of the subjects are taught in English and students can earn the required number of credits for graduation by completing subjects taught in English only.

Facilities

▶ G-Square (Tama Campus)

An event space for cross-cultural exchange among Foreign Students and Japanese students.



▶ Academic Support Center (Tama Campus)

A center for academic support located in the new educational complex named “Forest Gateway Chuo” in Tama Campus, established in April 2021. It accommodates our “Writing Lab,” where international students can receive guidance from graduate students for writing and using Japanese expressions for course assignments, and for their graduation thesis.



▶ International Education Residence

An on-campus student residence in Tama Campus, where international students and Japanese students can deepen their understanding of different cultures through shared living quarters.

(Boarding fees: 62,800 yen/month and other fees).



▶ Chuo University Co-op

The university co-op provides various student services such as a cafeteria, a shop, training for qualifications, travel, insurance, and accommodation services.

*Subject to the Comprehensive Renters' Insurance for foreign Students Studying in Japan, Chuo University agrees to be a guarantor for the lease of student apartments.

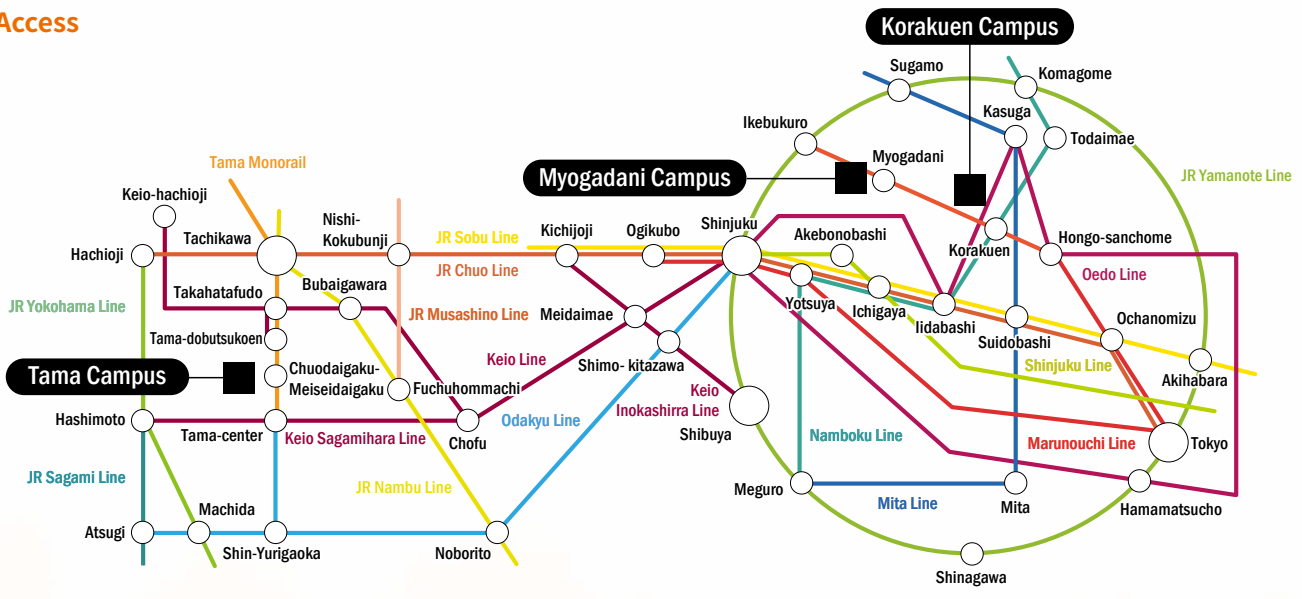
