

CHUO UNIVERSITY KOISHIKAWA CAMPUS BARRIER FREE MAP

(Created: January 2024)

The Koishikawa Campus consists of a gymnasium and an annex building. It is used for physical education classes and also houses multipurpose rooms, mainly used as club rooms and for student interaction. You can travel between Myogadani and Koishikawa Campus by train, bus, or on foot (about 20 minutes).

Access route from Myogadani Campus to Koishikawa Campus

The route between campuses from Myogadani to Koishikawa is downhill, and Koishikawa to Myogadani is uphill, mostly on gentle slopes but with some steep inclines (for 300m of Andozaka). Please choose your mode of transportation considering your situation.

Walking Route (Myogadani to Koishikawa)

1 Leave the Myogadani Campus building and head east on Kasuga-dori Street, which has an overall slope of about two degrees. It is approximately a 15-minute walk.

2 Kasuga-dori Street has an overall slope of about two degrees. Continue straight on Kasuga-dori Street, turn right at the Denzuin-mae traffic signal at the third intersection, and go down Andozaka. Be careful, as Andozaka has a slightly steeper slope of about four to six degrees.

3 At the end of the slope, turn left at the T-junction to arrive in in about two minutes.

4~6° Andozaka has a slightly steeper slope of about four to six degrees.

Train Route (Myogadani to Koishikawa)

To travel by train, take the Tokyo Metro Marunouchi Line train at Myogadani Station and get off at Korakuen Station. Exit from Exit No.1 and go straight on the Ushigome Koishikawa Line (Metropolitan Road 434) to arrive in about five minutes.

Bus Route (Myogadani to Koishikawa)

To travel by bus, take the Toei bus from the bus stop at the Kubomachi Elementary School in front of Myogadani Campus and alight at the Denzuin-mae bus stop in front of Andozaka. From the Koishikawa Campus, board at the Denzuin-mae bus stop.

Access Route

Train

A From Tokyo Metro Marunouchi Line and Namboku Line Korakuen Station to the Main Entrance



Exit from Exit No.1* next to Metro M Korakuen and turn right. Continue straight on the Ushigome Koishikawa Line (Metropolitan Road 434) for about five minutes to arrive.

*Exit No.1 has a slope and leads to a store in the basement Level 1. To reach the ticket gates (1F), please use the elevator inside the store.

B From Iidabashi Sta. on the JR Chuo or Sobu Line to the Main Entrance



Exit from the East Exit and cross the pedestrian crossing at Iidabashi Intersection. Continue straight along the Metropolitan Expressway (Mejiro-dori Street). Turn right at the intersection at the west end of the Shin-Ryukei-bashi Bridge and proceed on the Ushigome Koishikawa Line (Metropolitan Road 434) to reach the Koishikawa Campus. It is approximately a 15-minute walk.



When coming from the Tokyo Metro Namboku Line or Yurakucho Line, you can use the Sotobori-dori Street elevator to get to the Iidabashi Intersection.
